When state end services to currently covered service:

1. Change of ownership- the state will no longer provide monitoring services.
2. Monitoring (yearly) - shows 3 consecutive samples that are non-detected or below standard levels. When this occurs the homeowner has the option of keeping the current POET System at their own expense, including monitoring or the State of New Jersey will remove the POET system (NJ pays for the removal).
3. If the homeowner continues to monitor well (at their own expense) and two samples show levels above standard for chemical they can reapply for state monitoring services.
